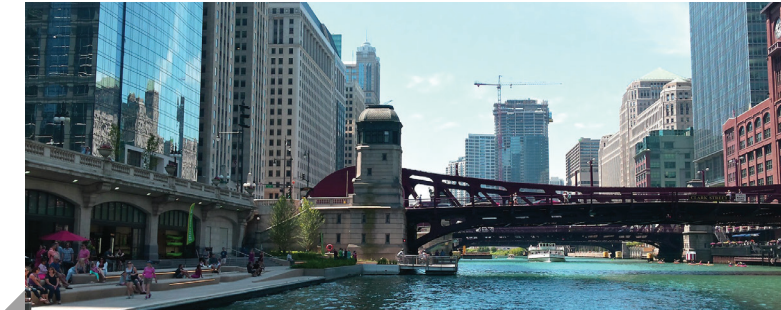

Do You Want to Go Fishing?

Either being asked that question or asking that question always puts a smile on my face and a bit of joy in my heart! June is really a great month to take someone fishing or be taken fishing. The weather is normally about perfect, not too hot and not too cold.

The spawn is over for most fish, the exception being catfish that spawn this month. That means fish really have only two things to think about, eating and not being eaten. June is the start of those very early to rise mornings or stay up late nights to maximize your best fishing. Match the hatch will be very important. Young of the year panfish make up a large part of gamefish diet in June so use lures that have the colors, size and profile of those young fish. Recently shad have become dominant in many waters. I can't think of a better bait than a rattle trap to match that hatch.

I have often suggested hiring a guide to catch more fish and add to your book of fishing knowledge. This is especially true when going on a fishing vacation or if you have a limited number of days to fish. Locally I would suggest fellow club member Jim Kopjo, the Crappie Professor. His pontoon boat is family friendly and he is great with kids of all ages. For Lake Michigan, Captain Ernie Booth and his boat Lucky Kid II. Based in Waukegan he has access to deep water and his boat is wide and very stable for those choppy days. For local gamefish T-Bone, based on the Fox Chain and frequent club speaker, will put you on Muskie, Walleyes and an assortment of panfish.

So the question is, do you want to go fishing?!
